Guide to Using Your Testing Accommodations

Step 1: Give your Letter of Accommodation to your Professor

Step 2: Discuss with professor whether you will be taking your accommodations in a space the professor provides <u>OR</u> the Student Accessibility Services Testing Center.

Step 3: If taking a test in the SAS Testing Center:

- Make sure you have enough time to take your test with extended time. If not, talk to your professor about a time that fits your schedule (we can help you with this!)
- Once you know when you will be taking your test, let us know by filling out this survey: Schedule your exam or quiz at the SAS Testing Center!
- PLEASE give us at minimum two *business days' notice* before your exam or quiz.
- If you or your professor change the day or time of your exam please notify us right away so we can adjust your reservation.

Step 4: Show up for the exam at the Testing Center!

- We recommend coming at least 5 minutes in advance so we can get you seated on time.
- You will be asked to leave your personal belongings (including cellphone) in a safe space before entering the testing rooms.
- You will have access to scrap paper, ear plugs, and white noise machines unless otherwise instructed by your professor.
- You will also have access to bathroom facilities in our center while testing unless otherwise instructed by your professor.
- You will be monitored by camera while taking exams. If there is ever a concern around academic integrity, we will shut down the exam and refer the situation to your professor for review.

Frequently Asked Questions on Testing with Accommodations:

Does extended time count on take home exams?

No, any exam that is given for an extended window of time is considered untimed. Generally, any exam with a window longer than 6 hours standard time is considered untimed unless the professor determines otherwise.

Does extended time on exams count on assignment deadlines?

No, extended time on exams and quizzes only refers to timed assessments-not homework or other assignments which provide a window of time for completion.

Are there exams for which my accommodations will not be provided?

There are very rare situations in which an accommodation may compromise an essential element of an exam and will not be authorized for that specific assessment. This is determined on a case by case basis between the professor and our office.
